## **Reflection** - *from Diana Gasson*

### **Faith – what is it?**

Last week we heard in Mark's Gospel 5:21-43 how Jesus proclaimed the great Faith of the woman who believed that, by just touching His cloak she would be healed. Jesus was so filled with love for the woman he said 'My daughter, your faith has restored you' and by calling her 'daughter' he revealed something of the mystery of the Trinity as she would have been an older woman you would expect Jesus to refer to her as 'sister' however, He told us to refer to God as Father which would make her a daughter of God, therefore 'My daughter' shows Jesus as being consubstantial with The Father.

In last Saturday's Gospel, Matthew 8:5-17 we heard of the faith of The Centurion, who understood that Jesus 'only had to say the word and his servant would be healed.' Matthew says Jesus was 'astonished' by the faith of The Centurion and healed his servant at that moment.

This week's Gospel stands in sharp contrast to the Faith shown last week. This week it is the people who are astonished, but instead of accepting Jesus as they find him as Jesus did with the Centurion, we hear In Mark 6:1-6 how Jesus is rejected as a prophet. He goes on to say, 'A prophet is only despised in his own country'. Mark tells us how he preached at the synagogue and 'most of them were astonished' despite this astonishment, they relied on their own knowledge rather than what they found before them; 'This is the carpenter, surely, the son of Mary...and they would not accept him.' They were unable to have faith in someone they believed to be 'one of them' how could somebody they 'knew' growing up, be this amazing prophet, Messiah, Son of God? And because of their lack of faith, Jesus could 'work no miracles there.'

This is so sad, but not uncommon; I've heard it said, "Judging a person does not define who they are... it defines who you are." I'm sure we've all been guilty at some point of judging someone by possibly one fact we may know about them, without really knowing them at all. It is difficult to do sometimes, but if we give a person a chance, we may even see a miracle!

So, what is faith? It may seem that I am saying Jesus needs us to have faith in order to perform miracles; but that's not what I'm saying, what I believe is that, without faith, we can't see His miracles, we can't even see Him.

To put it another way, there was a man driving around a very packed multi-storey car park desperately trying to find a space to get to his job interview on time. Becoming more and more frustrated he decided to pray: 'Lord if you could just find me a space, I promise I will go to Mass every day this week' just as he says this a driver pulls out of the space in front of him and he pulls in. As he is straightening up the car, he finishes his prayer 'don't worry Lord, I've found one!'
