Reflection for today *from Robert Draper*

As it was in the time of Ezekiel, so it is today; when those entrusted with the care of the sheep fail in their responsibility it is a cause of scandal – literally a stumbling block for others.

The history of Israel throughout the Old Testament is littered with examples of people being raised up by God as prophets, priests, judges and kings and being entrusted with the care of the people, but who have failed to carry out their task, who have used their status and role as means of enriching themselves and achieving power. Sadly, the scandal of unworthy shepherds has continued with the New Israel of God down to the present day, and neither the continual failure nor the fact that at times things have been worse than at present in this respect, should excuse the denunciation of such shepherds.

In the passage from Ezekiel, it is most significant that the word God speaks is addressed to the shepherds of ‘my’ flock. The sheep do not belong to the shepherds; they belong to the Lord, and to abuse the sheep for profit is not just a crime against the sheep – it is rejection of God.

When such activity is found in the Church, it is literally scandalous. However, it is also true that in all parts of society and in all structures that are established for the welfare of others those entrusted with responsibility to act fail when they do so for their own personal advantage at the expense of the more needy. Such behaviour is immoral and should be censured.

For Christians, the prophetic task of denouncing unworthy shepherds must always go hand in hand with the equally important task of self-examination and self-challenging. All Christians are called to acknowledge their responsibility and duty towards others. When Jesus steps ashore and sees the large crowd, he takes pity and sets himself to teach them ‘at some length’ – that implies a task that is not trivial or to be skipped over.
