## **Our Synodial Journey**

Although the Pope always uses his Bishops and Cardinals for advice, when there is a major problem in the church or world, he calls a formal Synod in Rome. He has called one in 2023 to discuss the crisis of the global pandemic and how it has affected the universal church. He is also aware that many people are suffering exclusion or isolation from the church for a variety of reasons and many voices are not heard. For this reason the next formal Synod in Rome will be very different in that we are ALL asked to give our views. The Vatican says that it will be the biggest consultation exercise the world has ever seen.

It will include those who regularly attend church and those who do not, the housebound, the homeless, those in prison, people from different faiths etc etc. We all have a part to play in this, it is a joint responsibility and during January and February we will be organising some sessions in the hall for parishioners from both St Mary's and St Anthony's, but we need to reach out to those who do not attend church. This is especially where we are all called to help. You will all know of neighbours, friends and family who do not attend church for a whole host of reasons. There will be simple individual forms available in the New Year for people to complete at home, they will be anonymous, it is a listening exercise. At this point we are not asked to try and problem solve, there are no right or wrong answers, the Pope is just wanting the views of as many people as possible.

## **PEACE SUNDAY**

Next Sunday, 16 January, is PEACE SUNDAY and this year Pope Francis asks us to think about 'Education, work and dialogue between generations: tools for building lasting peace'.

The need for peace in the world is obvious. People are struggling against violence and conflict, growing inequalities, the effects of climate change and the covid pandemic. How can we harness the gifts and energy of all generations in the work of peacemaking? Which 'tools for building lasting peace' do you think Pope Francis might be talking about?

In this country we have an active Catholic peace movement in Pax Christi, which does a great deal of good work to promote peace and nonviolence through parishes, schools and social media.

Their website suggests many ways we can all become better peacemakers. There are activities for families to do at home, including a peace liturgy for young children.
