MODERN SLAVERY ...spot the signs

Modern slavery is a serious crime being committed across the UK in which victims are exploited for someone else's gain. It can take many forms including trafficking of people, forced labour and servitude. The following are some of the signs to look out for and how to report a concern.



APPEARANCE

- Show signs of physical or psychological abuse and untreated injuries.
- Look malnourished, unkempt, withdrawn and neglected.
- Seem under the control or influence of others.
- Wear the same clothes every day.
- Wear no safety equipment even if their work requires it.
- Begging with no visible belongings.

ACCOMMODATION

- Living in dirty, cramped or overcrowded accommodation.
- Living and working at the same address.
- Appear unfamiliar with their
- neighbourhood or where they work.

WHO TO CONTACT:

If someone is in immediate danger then call the police on: 999

Report non-emergency suspicious activity to your local police on: 101



- Reluctant to seek help and avoid eye contact.
- Appear frightened or hesitant to talk to strangers.
- Fear of police, don't know who to trust or where to get help.
- Afraid of deportation, and of the risk of
- violence to themselves or their family.



Rarely allowed to travel on their own.

- Collected and dropped off on a regular basis early in the morning or late at night.
- In a crowded minibus with other workers. Have no control of their identification
- documents, such as their passport.


DATES FOR YOUR DIARY
